

Chuck Huntington



Chuck Huntington grew up fly fishing and tying primarily for selective trout in tailwaters and spring creeks. His fishing experiences have since diversified to include freestone rivers, steelhead, and the pursuit of a variety of lake-dwelling species. After retiring (or doing his best to do so), Chuck has rebalanced his life from decades spent as an overworked consulting aquatic biologist who fished too little and has returned to his roots as a fly-fishing bum.

Today, Chuck will talk about some things he knows about fishing the Callibaetis mayfly hatches of Crane Prairie Reservoir and East Lake in central Oregon, with an emphasis on how to find, pursue, and fool the trout that are surface feeding on these insects. His presentation will provide RFF members and guests with information intended to enhance their angling experiences on these two waterbodies.

President's Message from David Haight

June should be a great month for the Rogue Flyfishers. We will have one of our best outings for the year: Steve Day will be leading a trip to Crane Prairie on June 17 - 19 to enjoy the great trout and largemouth bass fishing the lake has to offer. Steve hosted this outing last year, and it was a lot of fun. We will also have our first dinner meeting of the year. Since our usual venue at Centennial Golf Course is still unavailable, we will be meeting at the Rogue Valley Country Club. It will also be a week later than usual, on June 22, to avoid a conflict with the Crane Prairie outing. Other than those changes, it will be a typical meeting with the Wet Fly starting at 5:45 pm, the business meeting and dinner at 6:45 pm, a great program by Chuck Huntington on dry-fly fishing in our local lakes, and a raffle. I am looking forward to both of these events.

June should also offer some good fishing in our area. Conditions in most of our streams and lakes were pretty dire in the middle of March, but with all the rain and snow we have received since then, conditions have improved significantly: The flows in the streams increased sufficiently to provide good conditions for anadromous fish migration, and with more water remaining in storage, flow should be much better this summer than they would have been. The water levels also improved greatly in many of our reservoirs. This has allowed improved boat access, and hopefully, will help maintain better fishing into the summer. Since the cool, wet weather kept many of our lakes cooler than usual for this time of year, several of our local trout and warmwater fisheries should be quite good in June.

The Southern Oregon Fly Fishers invited us to join them at their outing to Copeland Pond on May 7, and quit a few RFF members accepted the invitation. The weather turned out to be much nicer than forecast, and the fishing was great. We caught a very good number of quality-sized largemouth bass, plenty of nice crappie, and several big bluegill. It was a terrific event!

In turn, we invited the Southern Oregon Fly Fishers to join us at our May 14 picnic at Tou Velle State Park. Between the two clubs, over 60 people attended. From all the reports I received, everything was great. Steve Day served up a fantastic feast (as he always does), John MacDiarmid provide helpful casting instruction and entertaining games. Tim Bolling and Kirk Kowalke raised over \$1600 with the silent auction and raffle. I'm sorry I missed it, but since I was on a float trip through the Rogue Canyon, I wasn't too upset.

As I write this, I am getting ready to leave for the club's outing to the Owyhee River. Mike Masters is already there, and is sending back good reports. I suspect several people will have pictures of big brown trout to share at the next meeting.

We will have our usual summer hiatus from meetings in July and August, but will still have outings (Klamath Lake on July 13 and the Sly Lakes Wilderness on August 13 - 14), and possibly some other events. Dinner meetings will resume at Centennial on September 21, and on Saturday October 8, we will have our big auction.

I am looking forward to see you at the Crane Prairie outing and our June dinner meeting. In the meantime, I hope you are all getting out on the water and catching a bunch of fish—or at least, having fun trying!

Novice casters worked at improving their timing and tempo to produce a tighter loop and a few more advanced casters were adding the double haul to their casting quiver. Fourteen participants entered the 5Wt. Game. David Nilson and David Derrick had the top two scores. Alex and Steve Haskell tied for the longest cast, 84', while Brendt Hardcastle and David Derrick cast in excess of 80 feet. Casters were using a 5wt 9' Sage Zaxis rod and a Ballistic fly line.

Owyhee River Outing



Good times for all on the Owyhee River. Everyone had the thrill of the tug on their lines. From Monday through Sunday there were 167 fish caught, of them only 1 was a rainbow. All total, we had a group of 12, who for the most part had never been here before. Everyone enjoyed the scenic views of this high desert location.
