Conservation Opportunities

Help protect riparian habitat in Ashland – June 3rd, 6 pm. Ashland City Council Chambers 1175 E. Main Street.

ODFW is asking for our help to protect riparian habitat in Ashland. Dan VanDyke will be giving a presentation to the City Council with a short presentation about riparian habitat and suggested improvements to the ordinance. He is looking for concerned citizens, especially Ashland residents, to testify in support during the public comment period.

City staff think the ordinance is strong, but extensive clearing has been done on Bear Creek and Kitchen Creek over the last few years without being stopped.

ODFW's concern:

- Streams in the Ashland area make up the headwaters of Bear Creek. Stewardship in the Ashland area will be a primary driver of the future of Bear Creek.
- Both wild summer and winter steelhead spawn and rear in the Ashland area, and coho salmon are found more consistently in the Ashland area than in other portions of the urban Bear Creek watershed.
- Juvenile steelhead may live for 2-3 years in freshwater before migrating to sea and must have our stewardship to survive to the smolt stage.
- Climate projections forecast more challenges for steelhead and coho in the future. Warmer water temperatures are not only a direct threat to salmon and steelhead, but they also favor nonnative species that compete with our natives.
- We need a multistory canopy of native trees and shrubs along streams. We do not have time for "oops"—it takes years for canopy trees to mature, and we do not have years.
- Removal of exotic vegetation like blackberries reduces wildfire risk if that is a concern in a particular area.

A small group has been working on this issue. The group thinks that public support for riparian protection and strong code enforcement by the city is needed to protect the headwaters of Bear Creek. At least one addition to the ordinance may be helpful.

Roadside clean up and Salmon fly hatch fishing – June 5th.

Meet at Casey County Park at 9:00 am. We will clean up the park, then move on to MacGregor County Park, and then clean up along Takelma Road. Afterwards, we will fish the Salmon fly hatch at the Holy Water. Safety vests, gloves, trash grabbers, trash bags, and water will be provided. Please contact Rick if you are planning to attend.

Teach kids to fly fish with Trout Unlimited – June 15, 24, and July 8

We have a rewarding chance to stand side by side with young folks to teach them some fly fishing techniques and to share our vision of protecting and repairing cold water fisheries. This TU sponsored event is found online at TU Unlimited Expeditions and will be a once only occurrence in our area. I hope your calendar is open on the following dates:

June 15-college group, meet at 11am at Topsy Campground. June 24-high school group, meet at 4 pm at Topsy. July 8-high school group, meet at 4pm at Topsy.

Each group has ten participants, and they will have their own gear. They chose this location because of the dam removal story and the campground is close to where JC Boyle was. The vision is that each mentor would share a few hours with their mentee. Mentors can stay as long as they want and tag along on any of their week long events.
