

We have a lot of great things planned for this year. We have a very full schedule of fun outings. We will be offering a beginning fly fishing class, and hopefully other classes. We will have our monthly meetings on the third Wednesday of each month, but note the following exceptions: Our April meeting will be the joint fly-tying meeting with the Southern Oregon Fly Fishers on **Thursday April 20**. We will not have dinner meetings in May or June, but will have a picnic on **June 10**. As usual, we will not have meetings in July and August. Our **December meeting** with be on the 13th instead of the 20th to avoid conflicts with the holidays.

Our February meeting will feature a program by Ryan Allred about fishing the Klamath River. The Klamath River is close and offers great fly fishing for steelhead and trout. This should be an interesting program for those of us that want to learn more about these fisheries.

Also this month, we will have two outings to the *Land of Umpqua*. On February 10, Dave Grosjaques will lead an outing to Cow Creek. When conditions are right, this small stream offers fantastic fishing for winter steelhead. Dave knows this creek well, and can show you where and how to catch fish. Then on February 23, we will have the outing to the South Umpqua, which was advertised in the January newsletter. The South Umpqua has a large number of hatchery steelhead, but also has a good run of wild steelhead that can reach pretty impressive sizes. Both of these outings should be fun and informative.

Financial News by Tim Bolling

In an attempt to have the financial status of the Rogue Flyfishers be more transparent, I will occasionally have an article in the club newsletter explaining how and why we handle our finances the way we do.

As Auction Chair, I was frequently asked what we do with the money we raise at the auction. 70% of what we net at the auction is set aside and used to fund various grants and other requests we get from other organizations. Those organizations must complete a Grant Request Form (found on our website) where they must indicate the purpose of the funds and how that project will directly benefit the Rogue River Watershed. That grant request is reviewed by a Board Member(s) who then make a recommendation to the full Board of Directors. So, for example, at the December Board meeting a request for \$ 2500 was received from the Rogue River Watershed Council and approved. In addition to the "unrestricted" Grant Fund (funded by the auction), we also have a "restricted" grant fund. All money in the "restricted" grant fund was donated to the club with a stipulation that the money be used for a specific project or purpose. At present all the money we have in the "restricted" grant fund is earmarked for youth programs. So, we also received a grant request at the December Board meeting from the Oregon Stewardship organization for \$ 1000 which we also approved.

Okay, so what about the remaining 30% that we raise at the auction along with all the money the club collects? I'll go through a list of administrative and other expenses we have in a future article.

An Introduction To The Art, Science and Joy of Fly Fishing

John Pogue and John MacDiarmid will conduct a fly fishing class for beginners on Saturday May 6. In this one day class participants will learn everything needed to fish the Rogue for steelhead and trout. The class will cover wading equipment, rods, reels, lines, leaders and flies. Basic knots will be taught and there will be a section on entomology, aquatic insects, and the flies that imitate them. The final lesson will be on presenting the fly and casting. If you have a rod, reel and line, bring them but do not buy equipment for the class. We will answer the question, what rod should I buy? The club has rods for the class, let the instructor know if you need a rod. Each year in late May and early June a large stone fly hatch occurs in the upper Rogue River above Shady Cove. The class will cover how to fish this hatch.

You must be a current member of the Rogue Flyfishers to take this class. You can join on line at the club's website. There will be a \$10 charge to cover the cost of a small book, The Curtis Creek Manifesto.

The class will be held on May 6 from 9 to 3:30 at the Madrone Hill Mobile Home Park club house. The park is located at 8401 Old Stage Road not far from Gold Hill.


