Concerns have been raised to the Board that some members are uncomfortable at the meetings due to the lack of precautions being taken to prevent the spread of Coronavirus. Everyone is encouraged to wear masks when not eating or drinking so that we can all feel safe to attend.

Coastal Winter-Steelhead Outing, January 29 and 30

The winter months can be a slow time for many fly fishers in Southwest Oregon. Many of our favorite lakes are frozen over. The trout in the lakes and streams that are open are less active and less likely to take our flies. Here in the middle and upper Rogue River, the summer steelhead fishing is past its prime, and the winter steelhead have yet to arrive. One location that does offer good opportunities for fly fishers this time of year are the coastal streams, where fishing for winter steelhead is in full swing. A number of streams along the Southern Oregon coast are open to winter steelhead fishing, and they offer fly fishers a variety of options, from drifting flies through pockets in small creeks to swinging flies through broad runs on large rivers.

On January 29 and 30, the Rogue Flyfishers and Southern Oregon Fly Fishers are planning a joint outing to the coast to fish for winter steelhead. We will base the outing out of Brookings, which has a good variety of motels, RV parks, and restaurants. Participants should bring equipment for both swinging and dead-drifting flies. For swinging flies, a seven or eight-weight Spey rod with a Skagit head and a variety of sink tips would work well. A single-handed eight-weight rod would be ideal for fishing the smaller streams. Bring a variety of intruder-style flies—from bright to somber—for swinging, and egg pattern, large nymphs, and egg-sucking leeches for dead-drifting. Be sure to bring waders and raingear. For the outing, we will focus on areas that offer good opportunities for fishing from the bank; however, the lower Rogue and Chetco Rivers do offer good opportunities for those with driftboats or rafts that want to make a drift.

As we get close to the date of the outing, we will decide which streams we will target based on weather, flows, and fishing conditions. People interested in attending the outing should email me (David Haight) at tmdrhaight@infostructure.net by January 24 to get on the list. I will make decision about what streams to target and when and where to meet, and I will send out that information to the people that have signed up.

HEADS UP! Great Crane Prairie Pattern!

FUZZY BALANCED LEECH

HOOK: TMC403BLJ, 60 degree jig hook, SIZE 12

SHOWN, Wide gape, Medium wire, Super fine

Barbless Point, Black Nickle, Size 16-10

THREAD: VEVVUS 6/0 Black

BEAD: HARELINE PLUMMETING TUNGSTEN,

Metallic Brown, SIZE 7/64" SHOWN

TAIL: Marabou, BROWN SHOWN

TAIL FLASH: Midge Flash, ROOT BEER PEARL

SHOWN

BODY: HARELINE MICRO UV POLAR CHENILLE, UV BROWN SHOWN



TYING INSTRUCTIONS

Place hook upside down in vise and begin by laying a thread base down from the hook bend at the eye, rearwards to just in front of the bend of the hook.

Prepare a heavy-duty sewing pin by cutting to a length of approximately 3/8 of an inch. Place the bead onto the pin and secure the pin and bead component to the top of the hook shank, extended style. The gap between the eye bend on the hook and the back of the bead should be at least equal to the width of the bead. Continue to secure this by wrapping thread up to the back of the bead forcing it forward into the head of the pin. Once secure, use super glue or thin UV cement to make certain it stays firmly attached to the hook. When I'm tying more than just a couple of these, I will prepare the hook / extended bead chassis ahead of time prior to finishing the pattern.

Tie in a tail of Marabou tips equal to the length of the body including the bead assembly. Tie in two strands of midge flash on each side of the tail. The flash length should not exceed the length of the tail.

For the body, tie in a single strand of UV Micro Polar Chenille at the tie in point for the tail. Wrap forward with touching wraps up to the bead. Tie off and whip finish. Trim off the chenille as needed for uniformity in length as some fibers can be slightly unruly. A size 12 pattern should finish approximately 1 ½" in length.

This pattern is very simple to tie. It can be tied in various colors and I like them all, as long as it's brown. Seriously, the brown has been very effective as has black. Experiment with colors.

Typically, this pattern would be fished under an indicator, however it can be stripped as well. This pattern has fished very well at Diamond Lake, Upper Klamath Lake, Crane Prairie and others and it is very attractive to not only trout but warm water fish species as well.

Give it a try. I know you'll like it,
