President's Message from David Haight

I hope everyone enjoyed the holidays, and is looking forward to 2023. This coming year should be a good one for the Rogue Flyfishers. It looks like things are finally getting back to normal after the disruption caused by the pandemic: Attendance at the monthly meetings is improving (but still could be better). We have filled all eleven positions on the Board of Directors. We have volunteers to fill all of the Committee Chairs and other essential roles in the club. We will be resuming classes. We have a full outing schedule that will provide members the opportunity to experience a wide variety of fisheries in the local area and the broader region. We also have a great slate of speakers lined up for the monthly meetings. That being said, we are still looking for members to help with various projects and tasks, and will be looking at ways to enhance the club and attract new members.

With the start of the new year, Steve Day and Kirk Kowalke are going off the Board of Directors; however, they have both offered to keep doing most of the jobs they have been doing within the club. They have both done a tremendous amount of work for the club, and we are grateful for all they have done and will continue to do. Bill Burns and Dale Day were elected to the Board at the December meeting. Tammy Dedrick subsequently offered to serve on the board and was appointed to fill the position that was vacated earlier this year. Thank you to these individuals for volunteering to serve the club.

As I write this message, we are just about to celebrate the new year with our annual chili feed at the Holy Water. At this point, the weather forecast looks good, and we should have a great time. At the end of January, the club will have an outing to the Southern Oregon Coast to fish for winter steelhead. Look for details in the article in this newsletter.

For those that will be fishing for winter steelhead in the Rogue River or other streams along the Southern Oregon Coast, be aware that starting this year you will need a Rogue-South Coast Steelhead Validation on your angling license. Check the Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations for details.

Dan VanDyke, the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's Rogue District Fisheries Biologist, will attend our January meeting to explain this change, tell us about the new Rogue-South Coast Multi-Species Conservation and Management Plan, and answer our questions. To allow time for this, we will start the January meeting 15 minutes early-at 6:30 PM.

With the successful auction we had last October, we have been able to resume making financial contributions to projects and programs that are beneficial to our local fisheries and natural resources. At our December meeting, the Board approved a \$2500 grant to the Rogue River Watershed Council to support their habitat restoration programs in the Rogue Basin, and a \$1000 grant to Oregon Stewardship to support environmental education in local schools.

If you haven't already renewed your RFF membership, please do so. You can renew at the January meeting, or you can fill out and mail in the form included in this newsletter along with your payment.

I am looking forward to a great year ahead for the Rogue Flyfishers. I am excited to see attendance at the meetings improving, more classes and activities being offered, our participation in education and environmental programs resuming, and the Rogue Flyfishers getting back to where it was before the pandemic and improving from there!



Coastal Winter-Steelhead Outing, January 27 - 29

January can be one of the slowest months for fly fishers here in the Rogue Valley; however, several streams along the Southern-Oregon coast can offer great fishing for winter steelhead. These streams range from small creeks to large rivers, and offer fly fishers options from drifting flies through small pockets to swinging flies through broad runs.

The Rogue Flyfishers and the Southern Oregon Fly Fishers are planning a joint outing to the coast, from January 27 through 29, to fish for winter steelhead. We will base the outing out of Brookings, which has a good variety of motels, RV parks, and restaurants. We will try to fish several of the streams in the area, but where we fish will depend on the conditions at the time. Participants should bring equipment for both swinging and dead-drifting flies. For swinging flies, a seven or eight-weight Spey rod with a Skagit head and a variety of sink tips would work well. A single-handed eight-weight rod would be ideal for fishing the smaller streams. Bring a variety of intruder-style flies-from bright to somber for swinging, and egg pattern, large nymphs, and egg-sucking leeches for dead-drifting. The winter steelhead on the coastal streams can be large, so 10 to 15-pound leader would be appropriate. Be sure to bring waders, a wading staff, raingear, and warm clothing. Beginning this year, you need to have a Rogue-South Coast Steelhead Validation in addition to your Angling License and Combined Angling Tag. We will focus on areas that offer good opportunities for fishing from the bank; however, the lower Rogue and Chetco Rivers do offer good opportunities for those that want to fish from their driftboats or rafts.

People interested in attending the outing should email me at tmdrhaight@infostructure.net by January 22 to get on the list. I will make a decision about what streams to target and when and where to meet, and I will send out that information to the people who have signed up. There is also the possibility that the streams could be blown out; thus, the outing could be postponed.
