An Introduction To The Art, Science and Joy of Fly Fishing

In this one day class for beginners and novices, you will learn everything you need to get started fishing the Rogue for steel head and trout. The class will cover wading equipment, rods, reels, lines, leaders and flies. Basic knots will be taught and there will be a section on entomology, aquatic insects, and the flies that imitate them. The final lesson will be on presenting the fly and casting. If you have a rod, reel and line, bring it but do not go out and buy one for the class. We will cover what rod to buy in the class. The club has rods for the class, let the instructor know if you will need one. Each year in late May and early June, a large stone fly hatch occurs in the upper Rogue River above Shady Cove. The class will cover how to fish this hatch.

You must be a current member of the Rogue Flyfishers to take this class. There will be a \$10 charge to cover the cost of a small book, The Curtis Creek Manifesto.

The class will be held on May 12 from 9 to 3:30 at the club house for the Madrone Hill Mobile Home Park. The park is located at 8401 Old Stage Road not far from Gold Hill. Traveling North on I-5 take Exit 40 at Gold Hill and proceed South on the Old Stage Road towards Jacksonville, the park is well identified on the right.

John MacDiarmid a Fly Fishers International Certified Casting Instructor will be the class instructor. Email him at johnmmacdmid@gmail.com to register for the class. There will be a limit of 12 students, you must be pre registered to attend.

RFF Joins Rogue River-WORLD FISH MIGRATION Festival 2018

World Fish Migration Foundation formed about 5 years ago to create awareness on importance of open rivers and migratory fish (www.worldfishmigrationfoundation.com). Organizations around the world began developing events around the common theme of CONNECTING FISH, RIVERS AND PEOPLE. Locally, Rogue River Watershed Council and Grants Pass School District #7 elected to participate in 2018 and invited Rogue Fly Fishers to join about 25 regional organizations, agencies and individuals in an inaugural Festival April 7, 2018.













Bob Hunter pitched RFF's Board on becoming a Major Sponsor with five other organizations, and the Board agreed. The Festival fit nicely with RFF's twenty years of youth activities, most recently fly tying, fly casting, and ceramic local game fish, and occasional fly rod building and outings. At the December 2017 dinner meeting 18 members committed to participate in at least one youth activity during 2018. And the club has 6 TFO rod and reel outfits, about a dozen pedestal fly tying vises with bobbins, scissors, hackle pliers, hooks, feathers and other consumables. RFF had also received a donation of ceramic salmon supplies; clay, glazes and tools from Bear Creek Watershed Council as they folded into Rogue River Watershed Council. Most recently ceramic youth activities occurred in 2016 at FFI Fly Fishing EXPO in Albany.

Tyler Johnson and Andrew Chione Selected to Receive the Rogue Flyfisher Scholarships

Each year, the Rogue Flyfishers award two \$1500 scholarships to outstanding students in the Fisheries Sciences program at Oregon State University. We do this to help promote those individuals that we feel will go into careers that will help insure the future health of the fisheries resources that are so important to us. The recipients are selected based on their scholastic achievements, work and volunteer experience in the field, involvement on campus and in the community, career goals, and financial need. For the 2018 - 2019 academic year, the club selected Tyler Johnson and Andrew Chione.

Tyler Johnson is a senior, and was a recipient of our scholarship last year. He grew up in Idaho, where he developed an interest in fisheries while camping and fishing with his family. He has gained experience in the field of fisheries sciences while working for the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, and since moving to Oregon, has worked for the Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission, full time, for the last five-plus years, while going to school and maintaining a 4.0 GPA. Tyler expects to graduate with a degree in Fisheries Sciences at the end of winter term of 2018. After graduation, he plans to earn a Master's Degree, and then pursue a career focused on the research, monitoring, and preservation of aquatic and marine ecosystems.

Andrew Chione is a junior from Newberg, OR. Since transferring to the Fisheries Sciences program at OSU, he has maintained a 4.0 GPA. Andrew is also working while attending Oregon State, and has a high financial need. Andrew has worked seasonally for the U.S. Forest Service doing stream restoration projects, and for the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife surveying stream habitat and monitoring fish populations. He has also done volunteer work for the Yamhill Watershed Council and the Smith River Alliance. Once Andrew earns his Bachelor's Degree, he plans to go into a Master's program, and eventually would like to conduct fisheries research in the Pacific Northwest.

The Rogue Flyfishers are pleased that we can help these students as they work toward their careers in fisheries resources.


