Summary – Rogue River Point Source Phase 1 Study

With a grant from the Rose Foundation, the Rogue Flyfishers funded a biocritical study on the Rogue River by Rick Hafele. This is a brief summary of findings from that study.

Seven-point sources and sixteen sites along the mainstem of the Rogue River were sampled to answer the three main objectives of the reconnaissance study.

Objective 1: Is there suitable habitat for assessing the aquatic macroinvertebrate community above and below each point source.

Field assessments showed that suitable sites for macroinvertebrate assessments were present above and below each point source.

Objective 2: Do the results of the field data show impaired water quality and/or biological condition below any of the point sources indicating a release of harmful nutrient loads to the Rogue River.

It was found that one or more parameters generally showed some level of impairment, though the level of impairment was relatively small. The largest impact was observed below the confluence of Little Butte Creek. Various water quality and biological parameters were measured.

Objective 3: Are there any point sources with impaired conditions downstream that warrant in-depth follow up studies in 2024? If so, are they causing significant water quality and/or biological impairment that violate state water quality standards?

The entire river exhibited some level of nutrient pollution, which makes measuring the impacts of individual point sources more difficult. However, it is possible that one or more of these sources is contributing to biocritical violations, even though they are not the only cause of them. Future studies are under consideration, including the assessment of nutrient pollution in the lower Rogue River below Agnes.
