Members,

The last general meeting on October 19 was well attended and the members were treated to an excellent presentation by John Anderson who shared his secrets of consistently catching trout on the Crooked River of Central Oregon. John certainly renewed my enthusiasm for fishing the river where I have had mixed success over the years; catching fish when the hatch was on and not doing well when it was not. According to John, using the right nymph at the right time of year will produce fish consistently. Not having much experience fishing nymphs myself, I am looking forward to finding out for myself.

I hope you will mark November 16 on your calendar to attend the next general meeting at The Point for good fellowship and another excellent presentation. Speaking of The Point, the club was informed by the management just before the last meeting that dinner format is going to be changed. Because serving individual meals with three choices of entree has proven to be more difficult and costly than originally thought, The Point is changing the club to a buffet style dinner. We were given the choice of a one or two entrée dinner with two sides and a salad. The two entrée dinner would have increased the price by \$2.00 a meal and after discussion with the members present, it was decided to go with the one entrée meal at the same price as we are currently paying. Another wrinkle to the process is the fact that The Point now wants a guarantee of 30 meals. That means that the club will have to pay for any meals not ordered below the minimum. So, you can help "bottom line" by attending and eating at the monthly meetings.

I am pleased to report that the proposal to participate in the ODOT roadside cleanup project on highway 62 is going forward. New member Greg Hart has volunteered to chair this project and he has already at work getting the necessary paperwork started with ODOT. Once the preliminaries are completed, he will organize the first work party. With over 20 individuals signed up to do the actual cleanup, all that was lacking was someone to head the project, so we are most appreciative of Greg for accepting this responsibility.

At the general meeting on November 16, the election for the Board of Directors will be held. As per the By-laws, additional nominations can come from the floor at the meeting. Any member so nominated must be in attendance to accept the nomination and their name will be added. At the next regularly scheduled board meeting, officers shall be chosen for the 2017 year.

November Outing: Fall Chinook on the Southern Oregon Coast

Chinook are the largest and most popular salmon in Oregon, and many fly anglers consider them to be the state's ultimate gamefish. Consequently, many fly anglers head to the Southern Oregon Coast in the fall to try to catch these salmon as they return to the streams to spawn. The Rogue Flyfishers and the Southern Oregon Fly Fishers will join forces at Cape Blanco State Park for an outing on November 19 and 20, (weather and river flows permitting) to target these spectacular fish.

We will meet for an orientation at 9:00 AM on Saturday at the boat launch on the Sixes River Estuary, which is located near the Hughes House. Participants will have the choice of several fishing options: The State Park includes the lower three miles of the Sixes River, giving bank anglers access to several good sites. The boat launch on the estuary allows those with a variety of small boats to access plenty of good water. Two additional boat launches upstream provide those with driftboats or pontoon boats the opportunity to float portions of the river. Anglers can also walk or drive down the beach to the mouth of the Elk River to fish that popular spot.

As far as equipment, a ten-weight outfit with a shooting head system would be ideal. Bring heads (or lines) ranging from intermediate to fast sinking, so you can cover a variety of water and conditions, and 15 to 20-pound leader. Clouser minnows and comets ranging in size from one to two inches long are generally effective patterns. For the Clousers, black over chartreuse, green over chartreuse, chartreuse over white, brown over orange, and orange over white are popular color combinations. For the comets, green, chartreuse, and orange work well.

Cape Blanco State Park offers camping sites as well as a few cabins. The cabins can be reserved at reserveamerica.com. For those that do not want to camp, Port Orford is about 15 minutes to the South and Bandon is about 30 minutes to the north. Both have a variety of motels and restaurants.

The Sixes and Elk Rivers provide fly anglers with a great opportunity to catch Chinook salmon on a fly, and the last half of November is considered to be the prime time. If the weather and river flows cooperate, we should have a great trip. Since they often don't cooperate during the fall, be sure to check the club's website for updates.
