JASON A. ATKINSON...

... is a leader, filmmaker, a writer, and a public servant. After 14 years in the Oregon Legislature, he took a sabbatical to make the film "A River Between Us" documenting the largest restoration project in US history: the Klamath River. His life's work, Atkinson has been involved in the Klamath restoration negotiations since the Clinton Administration culminating in victory with President Obama. He was recently named in the top 20 most influential fisherman in the west and Field and Stream named him a hero of conservation. He has served as a Commissioner for Oregon Fish and Wildlife and founded Pastors Monday a non-profit that takes Pastors of all faiths fly-fishing on their day off. He is a Rodel Fellow with the Aspen Institute, a commentator and speaker on a wide range of issues. Atkinson works in the executive suite of the corporate sector building focused teams in finance, branding and as a negotiator. He has worked for over 20 years in the Middle East creating a leader-to-leader exchange program for the Kurdistan Regional Government and most recently working to place hospitals along the Jordan/Syrian border. He is an accomplished storyteller with three books and multiple articles published and remains a sought-after speaker. Atkinson serves on the board of directors of the Dove and Oregon Film and Television. He has an MBA from the Atkinson Graduate School of Management at Willamette University. His work has been featured in the New York Times, 60 Minutes, Men's Journal, MSNBC, Steelheaders Journal and the Drake to name a few.

Outing to Fish for Steelhead on the Klamath River

On Thursday November 10, the Rogue Flyfishers and Southern Oregon Fly Fishers will head to Northern California to fish for steelhead on the Klamath River. We will float from just below Iron Gate Dam to Klamathon. The Klamath gets a good run of summer steelhead, and the area above Interstate 5 fishes well late in the season. The river flows through a beautiful valley, and the fall colors should still be good, making this a great place to spend a day on the water.

The tackle and techniques we use here on the Upper Rogue work well on the Klamath River. Dead-drifting egg or nymph patterns through the long runs can be very effective. There is also plenty of good water for swinging flies. Like on the Rogue, small, somber flies seem most effective. Barbless hooks are required. Six to seven-weight single-handed outfits and light switch or Spey outfits are suitable. Bring a floating line, and if you want to swing flies during the middle of the day, also bring sinking tips. While there are a few places to fish from the bank, to make the float, you will need a driftboat, raft, or pontoon boat. The float from Iron Gate to Klamathon has some minor rapids, but nothing too difficult. We will try to find places in boats for those who don't have a boat. If you need a seat in a boat or you have a boat and can take a passenger or two, please let me know.

You will need a California fishing license and a steelhead tag. A day license is \$17.54 and the steelhead tag is \$8.38. You can buy them at the Blackbird in Medford. You can also buy them on the California Department of Fish and Wildlife website, but they will mail the steelhead tag to you, so if you buy it online, you will have to do so well ahead of time. There is no convenient place to buy the license and tag on the way to the outing.

We will meet at 7:00 AM on November 10 in the Rogue Valley Mall parking lot near the Crater Lake Avenue entrance and caravan from there. Since there is a possibility that weather or wildfires could alter our plans, if you intend to participate in the outing, please let me know at tmdrhaight@infostructure.net. That way I can inform you of any changes.

Come join us for an opportunity to hook some of Southern Oregon's largest winter steelhead on the South Umpqua River. The South Umpqua is known not only for its chrome wild fish but also for its enormous hatchery fish. And it's only a 45 minute drive from Grants Pass.

There is limited bank access and best fishing can be from a boat. For those who don't have watercraft to float the river, we have arranged for a limited number of spots for guided fishing by Zack Hancock Outfitters out of Sutherlin https://www.hancockoutfitters.com/#gallery. The cost of the guided trip is \$250 per angler and includes all fishing gear and files.
