Jeff began fly tying commercially at 13 and started guiding fly fishermen on Northern California's waters as early as age 16. He has participated with the F.F.F. as a Certified Casting Instructor; both CI and THCI and was the 5 th individual in the world to complete and pass the Double Handed Certification Test.

Jeff recently started his custom line of two handed spey rods for sale through his website. He possesses a true angling passion for steelhead on a spey rod, matching the hatch for spring creek trout and searching the tropical saltwater flats.

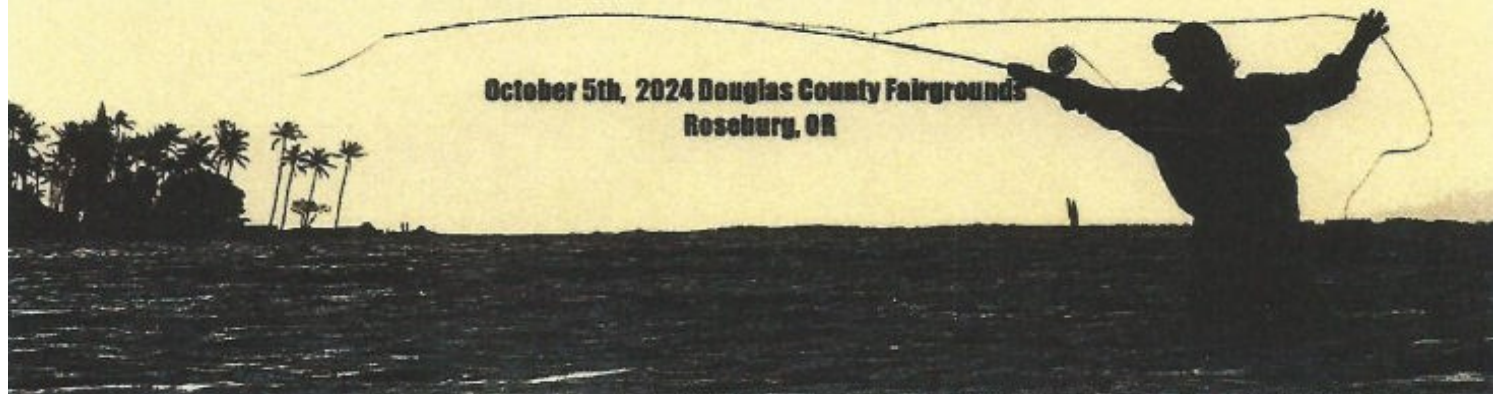

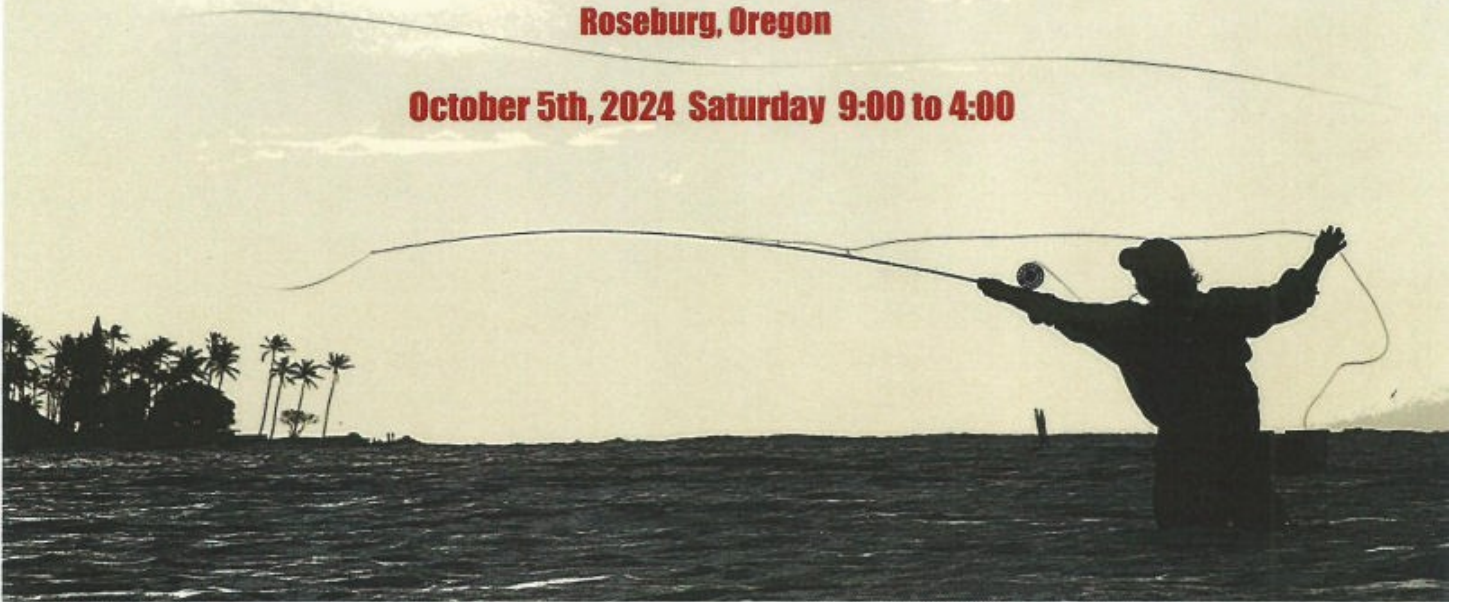

Financial Report – Tim Bolling

Through July of this year, the Rogue Flyfishers has given almost \$ 10500.00 to organizations in support of their various educational or conservation programs or paid directly for services related to the preservation and enhancement of our local waters! Organizations such as Rogue River Watershed Council, Oregon Stewardship, and Project Healing Waters are just some of those recipients of those funds. While a portion of the money donated has come as a result of direct grants, much of the money comes from one source – our AUCTION. Fully 70% of the net proceeds from our auction is dedicated to funding our grant programs so your support of the auction is critical for us to maintain our ability to continue to provide these much-needed funds.

In the August newsletter, I pointed out that the \$ 45.00 cost per person to attend the auction this year is a bargain compared to the cost of other similar fund-raisers. The \$ 45.00 though, won't even cover our total cost of the facility, caterer, and auctioneer, so your attendance and support is vital for our success. 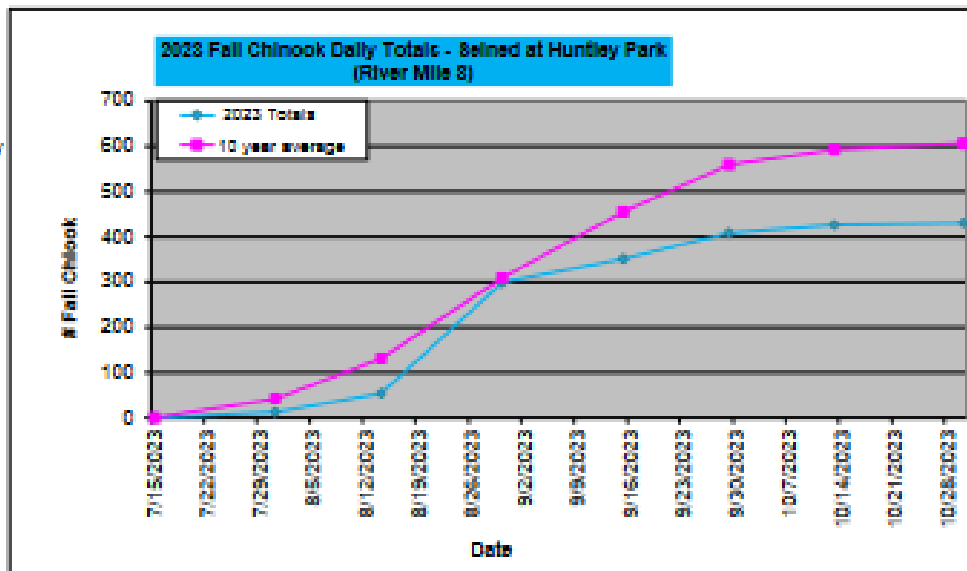
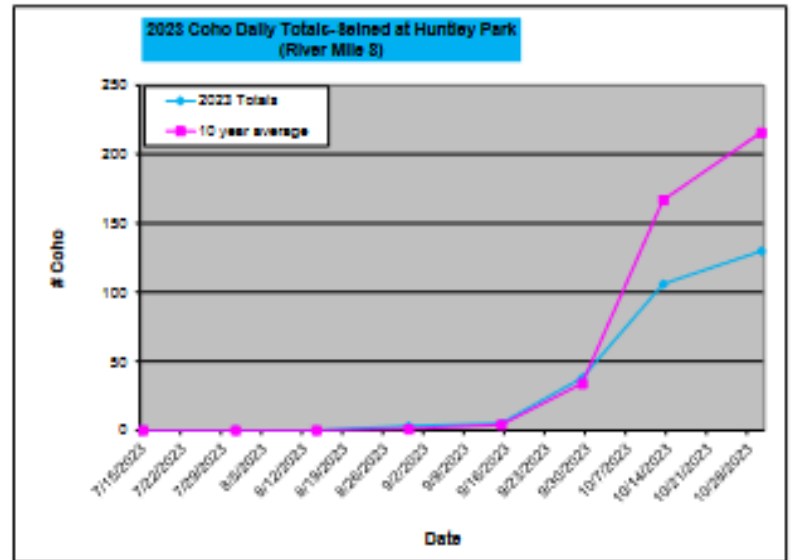
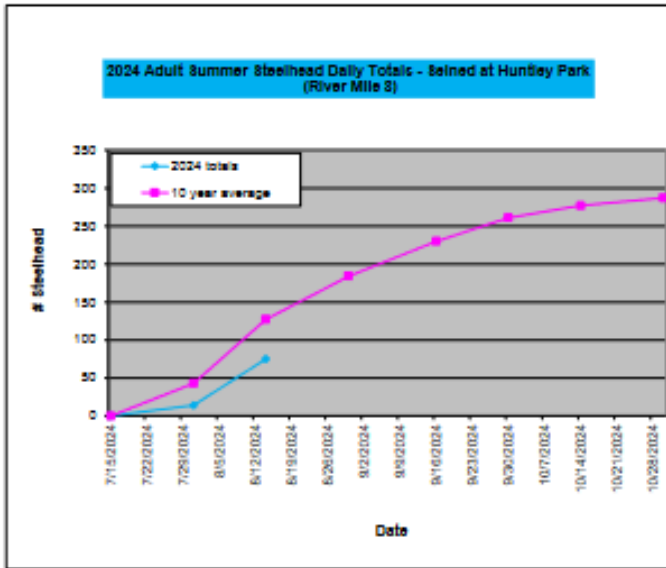


Report from the Owyhee River

After meeting up at Sportsman's at 7 am Iverson and I in one car loaded to the gills and Pogue in his new truck loaded up we headed out into a nice sunrise on our 9 hr. Drive to our cabin at Owyhee dam. Got unloaded in time to venture down to the powerline hole and slipped in along side several others. Several fish rising but hard to discern what they were sipping as no bug activity in the air. After talking to a few people we learned the size 22 midges were what was working though not very easily. Settled in with one of Pogue's homebrews and headed out in the morning. I was nymphing through a hole and Pogue was coming through behind me when he had a nice fish on. I netted a very nice brown for him and we marveled at the blue coloration along the gills and lateral line. Beautiful fish all of 20". I switched over to a streamer and finally had one on and had a very feisty rainbow to the net twice before it rolled and through the hook. Later the next day the wind came up and it got going well with all of us hooking fish in a short time. Then the wind changed direction which is what it does often in the canyon and they quit biting. One afternoon after we all just got back to the cabin a huge storm blew up, it came from directly over the dam and created a wind storm of incredible power. Dust from the recently burned hillside was horrible then came the rain. When it passed about 30 minutes later it left the biggest mess around the compound. Branches from cottonwoods were spread everywhere. Sure glad we weren't on the river when it hit so suddenly. Next morning Pogue had on a real hog until it through the hook. Then I netted a pretty 15" on a bugger. I walked up to the deadline and netted a brown. Did I mention how good we ate. Last evening out Iverson caught a hog rainbow. I was able to catch a fish on dry, nymph, and several on buggers. So a super good adventure to a amazing tail water which will only get better as the caddis and mayflies return.

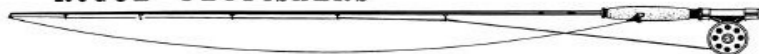
Auction Update
